



Digital Platform

Reading Skill Lessons


Reading Skill Lessons help students analyze content and sources. Every primary and secondary source in the program is accompanied by a skill question or lesson.

Reading Skill Lessons are intentionally placed within the chapter to optimize student understanding of specific skills—for example, a political cartoon source may be accompanied by a Reading Skill Lesson on analyzing visual sources.



Primary and Secondary Sources

Traverse incorporates a wide range of primary and secondary sources to enhance student learning. With up to five primary sources per chapter, along with additional sources for chapter inquiry projects, students are exposed to authentic and diverse content from the world around them.

Each primary source is accompanied by sourcing information and background to provide context for students.


Each source also presents an opportunity for skill practice, with interactive assessments available to reinforce learning.

Echoes of Today's World


Echoes connect classroom content to the world today, helping students understand how the learning links to their lives.

Teachers can easily differentiate and scaffold content with a lower Lexile level. When assigned activities, students will see a scaffold pop-out created specifically for their group learning.


